Schedule and Topics

October 19: Practical Strategies and Tips for All Educators Working with Language Learners

Educators attending this session will leave with multiple practical and real-life strategies they can implement with their students who are language learners. The panelists are all K-12 educators working with language learners who will share their techniques and tips for success to help other educators.

October 26: Incorporating the Science of Reading in Your Classroom at the Primary and Secondary Levels

This session will provide educators and service providers with a broad, comprehensive understanding of the Science of Reading and how it can be readily implemented in all tiers of instruction at both the primary and secondary levels. A review of the Simple View of Reading will help contextualize how to build specific blocks of time and interventions within the classroom. Integrated throughout will be a discussion of how to address issues facing multilingual children. Several web-based resources will be shared, as well as lesson plans that can be immediately utilized.

November 30: Language Foundations for Literacy

Five speech-language pathologists with expertise in language and literacy will discuss the five language domains and how they provide a foundation for literacy learning. Panelists will offer practical strategies that foster students' access to the academic curriculum while highlighting the reciprocal relationship between spoken language and reading and writing. Considerations for multilingual learners will be included.
